Its hard to write an obituary about a man like *Mike Foley.* How do you sum up a man's life in a few paragraphs, especially when he defined the phrase, "a life well lived".

Mike was married, had children, grand children, and great-grand children. He had many businesses in his retirement including being a landlord, owning a curio shop, and was never idle for a minute. He had a nice house where the children spent most of their summers swimming, hiking, learning to shoot, setting off fireworks at night, and of course, learning to fish, Mike's favorite pastime. From the memorial service it seems that Mike was a mentor to all the children and always had a ready ear to listen and talk about anything, anytime. They probably spent many hours around the kitchen table talking about everything, well into the night.

He was a long-time member of the Bass Club and split a lot of his spare time between them and helping us. Among many other things, Mike helped build nearly 50 wheelchair ramps for AM-BUCS.

Mike was a lineman for the Eastern Illinois Electric Co-op for a lot of years. In 1980, he won \$3.2 million in the lottery and actually got to call his boss and say, "Take this job and shove it!" But that was just for show. Mike continued working for a couple more years until he got stranded in a huge snowstorm and his friends said that was enough; go do something fun! He

started to travel more and saw a lot of the world. He went to Australia, Ireland, Egypt, and more, but his trip to Beijing, China, was his best. It was on that trip he met Priscilla Burnett. who was to be his



companion for the next 27 years and, along with his children, took care of him in his last days.

Mike was a country music fan and two country songs were played during the service, the final one being, "Leave a Light on in the Kitchen" by Ashley McBryde. It's a song about the promise that when you need someone to talk to, there will always be a place for you, and a light on in the kitchen waiting for you. It sums up the wisdom and willingness to help anyone at anytime that was Mike. It was what he did, not just for his family but for all of us. So tonight, Mike Fo*ley*, we'll leave a light on in the kitchen.
