October 12th was our 31st Annual Scarecrow Festival in AMBUCS Park. The Car Show was back on the West side of the park and we thank the **Sundowners Car Club** for bringing out so many great cars!

We had the usual hay rack and barrel train rides which were a hit with kids and adults alike. The hay rack ride is a good way to see some of the cars in the show and gives the parents a little quiet, sitting time.

The barrel train ride bumps the kids along a route which covers most of the park. There's also a small dip and hill that the kids love and where the driver gives the ATV a little extra gas.

He slows back down a little when he hits the flat land before doing a tight circle that has the kids and adults giggling. And the train can take kids with walkers or wheelchairs in the expanded engine car. There's a ramp into the car and the seats fold up. The adults are usually a one-and-done ride because the barrels have no shock absorbers and no padding on the seats. The kids ride over and over again!



The other hit with the kids is the many games we have on the east side of the park. Each player gets some sort of prize and we gave out almost 1,400 prizes! Students from the **U of I Alpha Phi Omega National Service Fraternity (APO)** come out in shifts to operate each of the 14 games we have. Anywhere from 10-20 students give us invaluable help running these games allowing members to work the food tent, bake sale, rides and car show. We can't thank them enough for coming out! And they seem to love it, too!

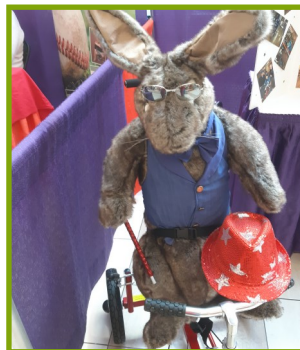

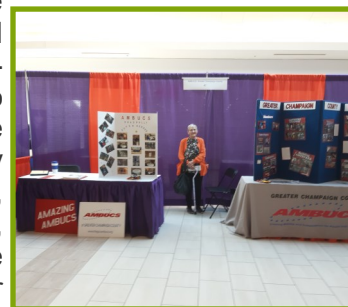
disAbility Expo
