Speaker: Ryan Reid, Rantoul Sports Complex

To start off the month of May, Ryan Reid from the Rantoul Sports Complex came to talk with us about this new resource in Champaign County. The complex consists of 8 baseball/softball

diamonds, 2 Little League/Challenger League fields, and 8 multi-purpose fields. This 60-acre complex had their grand opening on May 29th but the fields have been in use since the beginning of May. When things are fully



operational in 2023, they expect to have 1 million visitors per year! There are over 800 parking spaces, a playground and splash pad, concession stands, and restrooms. They are half a mile from I-57 so getting there is easy. All fields have a synthetic surface so weather related cancelations should be rare. The complex does not allow dogs, RVs, or beer. They



also offer free Wi-Fi on the site. While the Tom Jones Challenger League will continue to play their regular games at AMBUCS Park, they are open to having some special events at the complex. Ryan said they are also working with Special Olympics to have events at the complex.

Central Region Spring Conference

The Central Region Spring Conference was held virtually on May 11th. National AM-BUCS officers were in attendance and gave an update on our national health including our financial situation and our ability to get Amtrykes. They encouraged everyone to continue to order the Amtrykes they need so that they can plan purchases and get trikes delivered as soon as available. Sadly costs on newly manufactured trikes are going up 20% so those costs will be added to Chapter purchase prices on new trikes but not the models currently in the warehouse. National announced that the 2022 National Conference will be held August 24-27 in Birmingham, Alabama and that they are starting a new Capital Campaign with the details coming soon.

We have a new Chapter in our region, Route 66 Cruisers in Springfield, Missouri, bringing our Chapter total to 30 in the region. Our new Regional Director is Marsha Hamerstrand. Our new Big Hat Regional President is Brad Deluga. Carmela Davis was present and announced her candidacy for National President Elect and Luke Jackson announced he is running for National Big Hat Secretary/ Treasurer. Since there was no physical meeting we had an excess of funds in our account so the group voted to give \$4,000 to the National Scholarship Fund.

The meeting was wrapped up by asking for any announcements from the group. The Springfield Chapter announced that in 2025 they will be celebrating their 100 anniversary and planning has started for a multi-day celebration! Knowing the Springfield people it's going to be fantastic!
