
# **Challenger League Awards**

## Speaker: Jacob Dickey, Meteorologist

**The June 27th was meeting was a busy one** with an Amtryke giveaway and a visit from WCIA Channel 3 Meteorologist Jacob Dickey! Jacob is from Gibson City and when he was a kid he was on a "Kid Caster" segment on Channel 3. This is a segment where kids come on the air and help give the weather report with the station meteorologist. (For C-U folks, Jacob was on with Robert Reese. He was also a Weather Watcher later with station meteorologist, Judy Frazier.) This started his love for weather. Jacob says that the mid-day slot he has is as close to a 9-5 job as any weatherman can get. When the weather is quiet, he's just on at 9am and noon, and can do research and other parts of his job the rest of the time. But if the weather starts to get interesting, you'll see Jacob out at any time of the day in the Storm Chaser Vehicle reporting from the center of the ac-



tion. Don't worry, though, Jacob always stays safe during bad weather! He loves Central Illinois and when he was working at other stations he always had a clause built in his contract that if WCIA called he could break the contract immediately so he could come to work back here!
