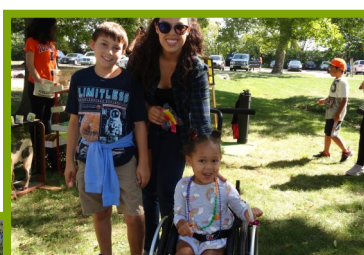

On September 10th, we had a visit from Central Region Director Donna Carlton-Vish. She came by to update us on National issues, sell tickets to the Danville Cash Bash, (her Chapter), and announce that she will be running for National AMBUCS President in 2020.

Donna has been working with Ray Griest and others on a project to have certain Chapters across the U.S. own Amtryke trailers that they use and maintain but are supported monetarily by National. The trailers are used in Road Shows where therapists and potential new chapter members can see our line of Amtrykes and how they can benefit people. This hands-on look at Amtrykes is one of the best things we have for building new chapters. Our Chapter is the prototype for this project. Other Chapters, like the St. Louis Chapter, use our trailer for a small fee to provide support, like new tires, etc. This will be the model for the other Chapter agreements across the country.



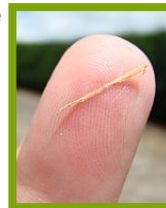
Another big National project is to have all Amtrykes made in the U.S. National officers have been working with a new U.S. corporation to make all our models. They are starting with the smallest Amtryke model and creating a prototype which they expect will be ready in about 6 months. They hope to have that one in production in about a year.
